
HEALTH-IT ENABLED CARE PLANS

Definition:

A longitudinal care plan (LCP) is a holistic, dynamic, and integrated plan that documents important disease prevention and treatment goals and plans. An LCP is patient-centered, reflecting a patient's values and preferences, and is dependent upon bidirectional communications. Electronic systems can pull together the various elements of the LCP dynamically to create an appropriate view for the relevant provider and/or patient/family member and provide actionable information to identify and achieve the individual's health and wellness goals along the spectrum of care.
